

## **Anne Frank: A Traveling Exhibit**

### Traveling Exhibition Fact Sheet

The Holocaust Center's "Anne Frank" exhibit begins with a brief history of the Frank family before the Nazis took control of the German government. After this shift of power takes place the text explains the changes that occur in Germany as they affected the Frank family.

In 1933, the Frank family fled their native country of Germany for Denmark. On the following panel there is a graphic of the secret annex in which the Frank family found refuge in 1942 as the Nazis began to round up Jews in Denmark. This image gives students the opportunity to imagine themselves in the hiding place that the family hid for two years.

The exhibit continues with a description of the betrayal and deportation of the family and the recovery of Anne's diary which is now known around the world. The next four panels give a concise explanation of the Holocaust as a historical event. Through words and images viewers are given the context of the world during the time that Anne Frank hid in the secret annex. Additionally, there is a panel dedicated to Jewish resistance and righteous gentiles. The final two panels give viewers contemporary evidence for the importance of studying the Holocaust. These panels describe genocide that continues to occur after the Holocaust and provide viewers with tools to combat genocide as citizens of the world.

**Content:** 12 framed panels and a display system.

**Loan period:** 4 weeks (longer or shorter by request).

**Space requirements:** Each framed panel is 23in x 30in in size. When set up with display system, exhibit needs 10ft x 10ft of space.

**Deposit:** \$250. Deposit must be received at least two weeks prior to loan period. Deposit will be returned in full when exhibit has been returned and evaluated for damage.

**Shipping:** Exhibit is shipped via FedEx Ground. Borrower is responsible for shipping and handling fees. The Holocaust Center will make shipping arrangements.
