

Holocaust Sites: Photography by Rudy Brueggemann

Traveling Exhibition Fact Sheet

The Holocaust Center's "Holocaust Sites" photo exhibit provides a visual tour of various concentration camps and Holocaust related areas in Europe. From the easily recognizable railroad tracks leading to the main entrance of Auschwitz, to the hot dog stand that is just outside the main gates of the current day museum at Auschwitz, these photos evoke complex questions surrounding the Holocaust. Some of the photos are unclear as to what the subject is, but a bit of critical thinking will push students to understand not only what the image is but what camp life might have been like for the victims and survivors of the various camps highlighted in this remarkable exhibition.

Content: 38 framed photographs (18in x 16in) taken in black and white, and color.

Loan period: 4 weeks (shorter or longer by request).

Alternate versions: A group has the option of borrowing any number of these pieces rather than the entire collection.

Deposit: \$200. Deposit must be received at least two weeks prior to loan period. Deposit will be returned in full when exhibit has been returned and evaluated for any damage.

Shipping: Exhibit is shipped via FedEx Ground. Borrower is responsible for shipping and handling fees. The Holocaust Center will make shipping arrangements.
